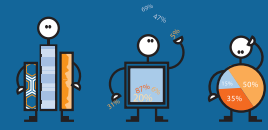

These statewide data are available for a wide range of topics measuring the health and well being of children, and more data will be phased in throughout 2010.

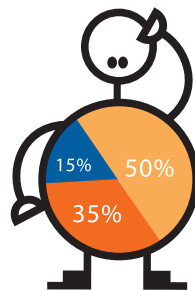

## Things To Know About Kidsdata

- It's a comprehensive website launched in 2004 that tracks hundreds of indicators on the health and well being of children in California, on topics ranging from alcohol use to immigration to weight.
- Data are continually updated, and, depending on the source, available for cities, school districts, and counties, along with statewide comparisons.
- Data can be customized by year, locale, ethnicity, age, and more (again, depending on the source). The results can be viewed as tables, maps, or bar, trend, and pie graphs.
- The site offers descriptions of why each issue matters and what the data mean, as well as links to related news and research.
- All of the site's content is available public information, that is consolidated on one site.
- Visitors from across California regularly use the site, which has been nominated twice for a Webby Award, the leading international award for websites.

## What Kidsdata Does

- Promotes the health and well being of children by making trustworthy information easily accessible to policymakers, service providers, grantseekers, media, parents, educators, and others who influence kids' lives.
- Allows users to find information they need – particularly local data – on one user-friendly website.
- Raises the visibility of key issues affecting California's children, and helps ensure that those issues are addressed.
- Provides data that help communities make decisions on programs and policies that affect children.
- Enables policymakers to set priorities, track progress in meeting established benchmarks, and identify new issues of concern.
